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religious diversity brings together outstanding essays in world religions by an authority in the field carefully chosen both for accessibility and as an outline of wildred cantwell smith s thinking these nine selections move gracefully through a wide range of concerns publisher

this volume illustrates both theoretically and empirically the differences between religious diversity and religious pluralism it highlights how the factual situation of cultural and religious diversity may lead to individual social and political choices of organized and recognized pluralism in the process both individual and collective identities are redefined incessantly moving along the continuum that ranges from exclusion to inclusion the book starts by first detailing general issues related to religious pluralism it makes the case for keeping the empirical the normative the regulatory and the interactive dimensions of religious pluralism analytically distinct while recognizing that in practice they often overlap it also underlines the importance of seeking connections between religious pluralism and other pluralisms next the book explores how religious diversity can operate to contribute to legal pluralism and examines the different types of church state relations eradication monopoly oligopoly and pluralism the second half of the book features case studies that provide a more specific look at the general issues from ways to map and assess the religious diversity of a whole country to a comparison between belgian french views of religious and philosophical diversity from religious pluralism in italy to the shifting approach to ethnic and religious diversity in america and from a sociological and historical perspective of religious plurality in japan to an exploration of brazilian religions old and new the transition from religious diversity to religious pluralism is one of the most important challenges that will reshape the role of religion in contemporary society this book provides readers with insights that will help them better understand and interpret this unprecedented transition

drawing on international and thematic case studies the critical analysis of religious diversity asks its readers to pay attention to the assumptions and processes by which scholars religious practitioners and

what is someone who has a perspective on religious matters to say about those who endorse other perspectives what should they say about other religions for example might some of their beliefs be true what stage are we human beings at in our religious development are we close to maturity religiously speaking so that most of the important religious ideas and innovations there will ever be have already appeared or are we starting out in our religious evolution so that religious developments to date are merely the first rude efforts of a species in its religious infancy

this substantial volume of thirty three original chapters covers the full range of issues in religious diversity an indispensable guide for scholars and students its essays make novel contributions and are crafted by recognized experts who represent a wide variety of religious and philosophical perspectives and backgrounds

as dialogue among the religions of the world has increased the promotion of these exchanges by christians both roman catholic and protestant raises the question of the motives behind these discussions some christians reach out in good will others display defensive hostility still others are simply following the mandates of their church religious diversity rather than pluralism challenges citizens of the world to learn from the differences between religions rather than glibly assuming their commonality acknowledging these differences in praise of religious diversity promotes active conversation rather than conventional dialogue as the mode of meeting between the religions only through a contemporaneous exchange of ideas can the benefits of diversity be realized this new level of communication poses an exciting prospect from which previously unrecognized alternatives for religion and relationships between religions might contribute to even greater human possibilities

should we merely celebrate diversity in the sphere of religion what of the social cohesion of a country there is a constant tug between belief in religious truth and the need for respect for other religions

religious diversity philosophical and political dimensions examines how far a firm faith can allow for toleration of difference and respect the need for religious freedom it elucidates the philosophical credentials of different approaches to truth in religion ranging from a dogmatic fundamentalism to a pluralism that shades into relativism must we resort to a secularism that treats all religion as a personal and private matter with nothing to contribute to discussions about the common good how should law approach the issue of religious freedom introducing the relevance of central discussions in modern philosophy of religion the book goes on to examine the political implications of increasing religious diversity in a democracy

new forms of religious diversity have emerged that demand specific policies from the state putting pressure on the established practices of religious governance european societies have been a testing ground for many of these changes but for decades canada has been pioneering the management of diversity thus offering interesting similarities and contrasts with the former this book deals with the diverging routes of political secularization in europe and canada the patterns of religious governance the practices for accommodating the demands of religious minorities concerning their legal regulation the management of public institutions and the provision of social services

muslims hindus buddhists and adherents of other non western religions have become a significant presence in the united states in recent years yet many americans continue to regard the united states as a christian society how are we adapting to the new diversity do we casually announce that we respect the faiths of non christians without understanding much about those faiths are we willing to do the hard work required to achieve genuine religious pluralism award winning author robert wuthnow tackles these and other difficult questions surrounding religious diversity and does so with his characteristic rigor and style america and the challenges of religious diversity looks not only at how we have adapted to diversity in the past but at the ways rank and file americans clergy and other community leaders are responding today drawing from a new national survey and hundreds of in depth qualitative interviews this book is the first systematic effort to assess how well the nation is meeting the current challenges of religious and cultural diversity the results wuthnow argues are both encouraging and sobering encouraging because most americans do recognize the right of diverse groups to worship freely but sobering because few americans have bothered to learn much about religions other than their own or to

engage in constructive interreligious dialogue wuthnow contends that responses to religious diversity are fundamentally deeper than polite discussions about civil liberties and tolerance would suggest rather he writes religious diversity strikes us at the very core of our personal and national theologies only by understanding this important dimension of our culture will we be able to move toward a more reflective approach to religious pluralism
